

E-mails

E-mails are great to get and sometime they are not so great! Not all e-mail programs work the same. They are not always received the same way as they are sent. People who send an e-mail, using the Windows O.S. - Outlook Express let's say, will usually receive them exactly the way in which they were sent if received by another Outlook Express recipient. On the other hand, a person using let's say AOL e-mail may send a person using Outlook Express an e-mail and the e-mail will look entirely different. A person using a MIME e-mail source to send an e-mail to an Outlook Express recipient may receive just a 'Web link' to click upon to interpret that e-mail. So, e-mails are not always the same.

The point am trying to make here is, have you ever received an e-mail and open it up to read it and there is nothing there? All you see is another link to click upon. You click it too and there is nothing there also? Me too! Been there done that too!

O.K. with that being said, it might be best for all users of e-mail, before you click onto that easy "FORWARD TO" button, to keep the information above in mind? If you would like to send someone an e-mail that you have received... over all it would be best if you copied the e-mail from your computer and open up a new e-mail "TO SENDER" window. By doing this... you have now made it easier for those you wish to e-mail to open and read your e-mail. You can do this by an easy 'Cut & Paste' technique.
